2016 NATIONAL CHURCH LIFE SURVEY RESULT FOR OUR PARISH:

POSTAL PLEBISCITE ON "SAME-SEX MARRIAGE"

ANNOUNCED: The Australian Government has announced there will be a postal plebiscite on whether the definition of marriage in the Marriage Act 1961 should be changed to include "same-sex marriage". Ballot papers will be sent out to households on Tuesday, 12 September and all votes must be received back by Tuesday, 7 November. If you are not enrolled to vote, or if you need to update your postal address, go to www.aec.gov.au/enrol/ before the cut-off date of Thursday, 24 August. To keep marriage as a unique relationship between a woman and a man, vote NO.
