2016 NATIONAL CHURCH LIFE SURVEY RESULT FOR OUR PARISH:

How People Relate to God: Personal Faith:

45% of attenders said they had experienced much GROWTH IN FAITH in the previous 12 months.

43% spend time in PRAYER, BIBLE READING, MEDITATION every day or most days

IMPORTANCE of GOD in people's lives: "God is more important to me than almost anything else" 39% and "God is the most important reality in my life" 46%.

These results are from the 140 forms (Adults) and 10 (Child forms) that were completed in November last year. Attenders could select up to 3 options so percentages may not add up to 100%.

POSTAL PLEBISCITE ON "SAME-SEX MARRIAGE"

ANNOUNCED: The Australian Government has announced there will be a postal plebiscite on whether the definition of marriage in the Marriage Act 1961 should be changed to include "same-sex marriage". Ballot papers will be sent out to households on Tuesday, 12 September and all votes must be received back by Tuesday, 7 November. If you are not enrolled to vote, or if you need to update your postal address, go to www.aec.gov.au/enrol/ before the cut-off date of Thursday, 24 August. **To keep marriage as a unique relationship between a woman and a man, vote NO.**
