**REFLECTION** - by Fr Michael Tate.

St Luke's account of the Annunciation draws on the Jewish tradition describing creation: 'There was darkness over the deep and God's Spirit hovered over the water. God said: "Let there be light", and there was light.' (Genesis 1:2-3) St Luke depicts Mary hearing in the depths of her soul: 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow.' The Holy Spirit hovers over this young Jewish woman so that the most stupendously creative act in human history can take place With her consent, God assumes human nature to be gradually enfleshed, embodied, in Mary's womh

A naturally bewildered young woman was able to respond to God's will because she understood the imagery and the symbolism of the Genesis Story. We, in turn, need to read the Gospels in all their Jewishness so that we can understand when God's Holy Spirit hovers over ou lives, asking us to fulfil some particular role in the Divine Plan We could pause for a moment to ask whether now is the time for a Marian response: 'Be it don unto me according to your word.'

DO YOU WISH TO ATTEND A WEEKEND MASS? You cannot just turn up for Mass as previously!! YOU HAVE TO REGISTER WITH THE PARISH OFFICE BY the

FRIDAY (12noon) BEFORE THE WEEKEND MASSES. We are unable to accommodate more than 90 in our Church, and it will not be possible to admit parishioners who have not pre- registered.

Please arrive <u>early</u> for Mass (at least <u>15</u> minutes beforehand). <u>Church doors are locked as Mass begins</u>, No collections are taken up at Mass. Usual Parish Collection donations can be placed in the baskets provided on the table at the Church entrance door. If you are elderly (70 years +) or not feeling well, the ruling states that, (for your own safety) YOU MUST STAY AT HOME.

When entering the Church for Mass, your hands will be sanitized and your temperature taken. (This is obligatory) then a Monitor will show you to a seat, where **Social distancing (2 sq meters)** must be strictly observed, (except for people of the same house-hold). Holy Communion (in a single file) **must** be Received in the hand <u>Nobody will be permitted to socially assemble in the courtyard before, during and after Mass</u>.
