GOSPEL READING -

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him, 'for this is what the prophet

And you, Bethlehem, in the lan of Judah,

you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.'

Γhen Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to wha the king had to say, they set out And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over

the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.

REFLECTION - by Fr Michael Tate.

Unlike the writers of the horoscope columns in our newspapers, these Wise Men were scholar astrologers, probably from Syria or Iraq. They believed that the stars controlled the destiny of human beings, but they were open enough to the Hebrew scriptures to be led to the amazing discovery of a starchild in Bethlehem

They knelt before this baby, doing homage, because they realised that the stars did not control this infant, but that ther was something of this baby which caused the night sky to respond! They preserved the child from the deadly schemes of Herod, and then they returned to their home country, 'by a different way'. They were on a different journey after encountering the Child.

Who can doubt that the Holy Spirit led these wise men from the East to the manger? In fact, the Holy Spirit is at work in eve human being, prompting each and every one to become seeke after Truth.

As a person responds to this d prompting and tries to lead a good humane life, then the Church teaches that the Holv Spirit can draw them into the saving life of God. Thus, billions in China and India who have never heard the Gospel, can be saved. But, such persons do not savour the fullness of Truth as we do with the privilege of having the scriptures and the sacraments. Where it is possible we are obliged to offer them the road map to the Truth.

We can take a moment to affirm our faith in the baby in the manger as the One of whom Dante spoke: 'the Love which moves the sun and other stars'. Come, let us adore him.

We are unable to accommodate more than 90 in our Church, and it will not be possible to admit parishioners who have not pre- registered.

Please arrive <u>early</u> for Mass (at least <u>15</u> minutes beforehand). <u>Church doors are locked as Mass begins</u>, No collections are taken up at Mass. *Usual Parish Collection donations can be placed in the baskets provided on the table at the Church entrance door. If* you are elderly (70 years +) or not feeling well, the ruling states that, (for your own safety) YOU MUST STAY AT HOME.

Holy Communion (in a single file) **must** be Received in the hand Nobody will be permitted to socially assemble in the courtyard before, during and after Mass.
