Reception of the Casket and Vigil Mass for Bishop Murray will be held in **St Francis Xavier's Cathedral**, **Wollongong (36 Harbour Street)**, at **7.30 pm on Tuesday**, **30 April 2013**. Mass of Christian Burial for Bishop Murray will be held at the **Cathedral at 11.00 am on Wednesday**, **1 May 2013**.
