

THE KINGDOM IS LIKE Throughout the gospels, Jesus consistently uses the figures of speech of simile and metaphor to describe the kingdom. He never directly describes the kingdom. URGENTLY NEEDED:

<u>MONITOR'S</u>: Thank you to the Parishioner's who are currently being Monitor's – you are greatly appreciated and thank you also to those who have volunteered to help in this Parish Ministry.

The role of the Monitor is also to help people enter the Church safely and to ensure social distancing and not to congregate before or after Mass, and other similar things. Each Mass requires at least 3 Monitor's (our attendee numbers have increased)- if you would like to assist in this important role - please contact the Parish Office (during Office Hours - 4628 2967).

<u>CLEANER'S</u>: The Church, where people have sat, and frequently touched surfaces, need to be cleaned after each Mass, to help ensure the safety of our parishioners-all materials are supplied. If you have a spare 2-3 minutes after each Mass to assist with this – it is greatly appreciated.

UPDATES IN OUR PARISH:

Parish Bulletin: If you know of a parishioner who is not receiving these emails please encourage them to contact the parish office. There are hard copies available at the entrance to the Church.

Planned Giving Envelopes 2020/21: There are still a few to be collected from the Parish Office during Office Hours.

WEEKDAY MASSES AT RUSE CHURCH: Those attending a Weekday Mass will NOT have to Register beforehand, only the first 70 Worshippers will be admitted. We are in urgent need of Monitor's for Weekday Masses also.

DO YOU WISH TO ATTEND A WEEKEND MASS? You cannot just turn up for Mass as previously!!

<u>Note:</u> emails and text messages cannot be accepted. *If* you are elderly (70 years +) or not feeling well, the ruling states that, (for your own safety) YOU MUST STAY AT HOME. After entering the Church for Mass, your hands will be sanitized and your temperature taken. (This is obligatory) then a Monitor will show you to your RESERVED seat, where <u>Social</u> <u>distancing (4 sq meters)</u> must be strictly observed, (except for people of the same house-hold)

No Holy Water fonts, No Votive Candles, No Offertory Procession, no Sign of Peace, Holy Communion (in a single file) **must** be Received in the hand.

Please arrive early for Mass (at least 10 minutes beforehand). Church doors <u>must</u> be locked as Mass begins, No collections can be taken up at Mass.

Usual Parish Collection donations can be placed in the baskets provided on the table at the Church door You are to sanitize your hands again as you leave the Church and Nobody will be permitted to socially assemble in the courtyard before, during and after Mass.

SOME STATISTICS from 2016 AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL CENSUS FOR RUSE PARISH 2016: PARISH PROFILE:

82% of Australia's Catholics lived in a family setting and 9% living alone.

In 1996 the median age of Catholics in Australia was 33 years. By 2016, it had risen to 40 years. Among Catholics in Australia, 48% were male, 52% female. Females accounted for 58% of Catholics 75 years and over.

In Ruse Parish, 694 Catholics were born overseas and 63 do not speak English well.
